Ate lobster on the coast of Maine and saw several more lighthouses on the east coast. Watched a total lunar eclipse— a red moon is an amazing sight!


Spent some great holiday time with my family at Snow Lake, MS. Labor Day '99 — I built a pier with my dad. Thanksgiving '99— raked leaves with my dad. Christmas '99— received my dad's old hunting greens as a gift. New Year's Day 2000, watched fireworks over Snow Lake with my dad and Elsie. What a way to bring in the new millennium! July 4th 2000— caught a dozen catfish while my dad paddled the boat and baited my hook— just 'cause he wanted me to catch the fish.

**God** has been so good to me. I am thankful to be able to write, to teach, and to sing about Him. Can't wait to see what He has in store each day...

**RESTORATION** - Thirty-one years of guitar playing finally took its toll on the tendon in my right elbow. In March, a wonderful surgeon did some major repair work on that tendon and elbow bone. Today, I can play quitar again PAIN FREE! On day six after the surgery, I woke up about 6am from a very deep sleep and a very fascinating dream. This dream was a musical one rather than a visual one. Such a thing has never happened to me. I came straight to the piano keyboard and recorded the tune that I had in my head and went back to bed. Before that day was over, song number 55 was born. The title of the song: Restoration. The lyrics were written with the assistance of my good friend, Mandy Kitchens, a writer and poetically gifted family nurse practitioner from Jackson, Mississippi. Mandy stood with me before, during (she was IN the operating room with me!), and after the elbow surgery. Chronic pain can do terrible things to a person. The enemy can use such pain to draw you into a place of total isolation and make you believe that you can never be well. I believe these lyrics speak for themselves concerning the healing that I have experienced from the hand of the Lord. You, too, can know this same healing in your own life.
